### **Deferred Action for Dreamers**

USCIS began accepting Deferred Action and Work Card Applications on August 15, 2012. So far, there appear to be about 70,000 applications in process and some work cards have been issued. We have been impressed with the educational and athletic accomplishments of the young people who have visited our office. These are the types of people we need in the U.S. to help our economy and to build our nation. ### **Phase-out of Form I-94 Around the Corner/CBP Discontinues Stamping Form I-20 at Ports of Entry**

The most important document in a foreign national's passport is the white card called the Arrival/Departure Document. This card contains the person's immigration status and date for departure. In a cost-saving measure the CBP plans to rely on computer entry of this information. Furthermore, for students on F-1 visas the CBP is no longer stamping the School Form I-20's. Both of these measures are problematic. Employers rely on the Form I-94 to complete the I-9 Forms for employment eligibility. Foreign nationals need to know when they must depart. And, DMV's and other agencies need this Form to grant benefits. Furthermore, presently, the CBP is backed up for months in entering I-94 data in its databases.

### **DV Lottery starts Oct. 2, 2012**

The Diversity Visa Lottery which grants 50,000 Permanent Resident Visas to citizens of countries with historically low immigration rates to the U.S. is open from Oct. 2, to Nov. 3, 2012. See instructions at [www.state.gov](http://www.state.gov) or contact our firm.

### **Congress Introduces Bills to Grant More Immigrant Visas to the Highly Skilled**

Republicans and Democrats have introduced bills granting more immigrant visas to technology and science grads of U.S. universities. The Republican bill would eliminate the DV visas.
